- Registration will be limited to the first 400 riders.
- **No refunds after August 15, 2010.**
- Full Refund minus \$50.00 Processing Fee for cancellations received before August 15th, 2010.

Registration fees are:

- **\$150.00** per person for full event participant (Includes Pit BBQ Dinner on Friday Night)
- **\$100.00** per person for a non-rider participant (Includes Pit BBQ Dinner on Friday Night)
- **\$100.00** per person for a weekend only participant (Friday and Saturday Only) - (Includes Pit BBQ Dinner on Friday Night)

TRAIL RIDE INFORMATION



PLEASE NOTE: We have added 3 UTV only rides – 1 each day. Wednesday, Ride #3; Thursday, Ride #4; Friday, Ride #17.

- 0. ATV Safety Instruction Class:** The course will be held on the Rodeo Grounds at 1:00 P.M. on Wednesday only. The course is 4 to 5 hours long. The course will be offered by the Arizona Game & Fish and only 10 people per class will be allowed. If you have further questions, please contact us by visiting our Contact page. **We strongly recommend all riders with less than 40 hours riding time attend this class!**
- 1. The Grizzly Trail:** UTVs OK! Available Wednesday, Thursday & Friday. This trail leaves from the rodeo grounds and travels through old grizzly country to Alpine. This fast-paced, all-day ride is around 105 miles with some rocky, rough terrain and steep hills to climb. (Because of these conditions, this ride is not recommended for sports quads.) You will have to have the endurance of a grizzly bear to make this ride. This ride will feature some of the more spectacular sites on the Outlaw Trail - tall, cool pines and aspen trees along the way. Starting elevation is approximately 7,000 feet and you will climb to elevations over 9,000 feet. Bring your camera for wildlife pictures, a sack lunch, and extra gas. This ride has been rated "Advanced".
- 2. Rustler's Loop:** ATVs only under 53" wide! Available Wednesday, Thursday & Friday. - This ride starts at the rodeo grounds, driving through Eagar to the Saffell Canyon ATV staging area. This all day ride will cover about 50 miles. The trail travels south to Pat Knoll named after Pat Trainor, an old Irishman cattle rustler that was tried over 20 times in Apache County courts and never convicted! This ride will feature several spectacular overviews of the Round Valley and Nutrioso areas for those photographers who desire a great picture. Bring a sack lunch. This ride is rated "Intermediate". Please note: A maximum clearance of 53" is available at certain points on this trail. If you are riding a Polaris Ranger, Yamaha Rhino, or a similar rig, please choose another ride because of the clearance problem.
- 3. Slaughter's Circle:** UTVs OK! Trailered Ride! Available on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. **On Wednesday - this ride will be for UTVs only!** This ride is a scenic, photography ride that will give the rider who loves wildlife and beautiful scenery an opportunity to experience it up-close & personal! This ride requires transporting your ATV to Lightning Ridge staging area, approximately 30 miles from the rodeo grounds. The ride is about 45 miles long and will take you through our beautiful high country where John Wayne had his summer range for his 26-Ranch located in Eagar. An awesome overlook of Blackriver where Ike Clanton is supposedly buried will also be a treat. Some of the route will travel south on the old Apache Railway grade to the PS Ranch now owned by the Arizona Game & Fish. This ride will also include a visit to the PS Lookout Tower to experience some awesome views of the area. Bring a sack lunch. This ride is rated "Advanced".

- **4. Robber's Roost Trail:** UTVs OK! Trailered Ride! Available on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. **On Thursday - this ride will be for UTVs only!** Friday. Many of Butch Cassidy's "Wild Bunch" were known to come to Apache County after the breakup of the gang. One of these "alleged" retired members (!), Hank Sharp, was noted to have roped a grizzly bear near this trail at Sheep Cinega. This ride will require you to trailer your wheeler about 16 miles to the Green's Peak Lookout turnoff. From here you will enjoy a leisurely-paced ride approximately 48 miles through beautiful high cinegas formerly used by ranchers for their summer pasture. This will take you to the highest point of the Outlaw Trail, Green's Peak Lookout, an elevation of 10,134 feet where you will have an awesome overview of the surrounding mountain country. Then visit beautiful Canaro Spring on the last leg of the trip. This trail is rated "Beginner to Moderate". Bring a sack lunch. **Ride Sponsored by Molly Butler's Lodge.**
- 5. Lawmen Memorial Ride:** ATVs only under 53" wide! Available on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday - This ride is dedicated with appreciation to the lawmen of Arizona that brought peace to this territory. This is a 10-hour, 100 mile ride, designed for the experienced rider who enjoys a little faster pace. The ride leaves from the rodeo grounds, climbs up through the forested mountains, wanders thru valleys and meadows where outlaws & rustlers once ruled, then to beautiful Big Lake for lunch. From there we ride thru John Wayne's 26-Bar Ranch summer range, then thru more forest as we wind our way back to the rodeo grounds. Learn about the Smith Gang, Arizona Ranger Carlos Tafoya, and of other lawmen that faced the many outlaws in this area and played their part in the territory of Arizona becoming the 48th state. You will ride thru the actual places where outlaws roamed and where some confrontations took place. The ride has some high mountain overlooks, awesome panoramic views, several miles of rough, rocky trail, some hills to climb, some road riding, but mostly trails thru the magnificent forest of pine, spruce, and aspen. Bring a lunch, your camera, and extra gas. Gas and snacks are available at the Big Lake store. This fun ride, rated Advanced, is not recommended for sports-style ATVs due to trail conditions. Ride Sponsored by Local Law Enforcement Agencies.
- **6. Lightning Ridge Run:** UTVs OK! Trailered Ride! Available on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. This ride will require transporting your ATV to the Lightning Ridge staging area. This trail will travel south along the old Apache Railway grade to Big Lake then over to the West Fork of Black River and then up the north side of Burro Mountain for a total of about 42 miles. Stop and get a cool drink from the North Spring while you take a break along the trail. This ride is rated "Intermediate" because of steep, rocky parts of the trail. Bring your sack lunch.
- 7. Apache Railway Holdup – CLOSED THIS YEAR!!!**
- 8. Ike Clanton Loop:** ATVs only under 53" wide! Available Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. This is a great slow-paced ride for the "Beginner" rider who wants to take a short 19 mile-loop out of Eagar. Great views will be seen from the Milligan Valley Mesa overlooking the Round Valley area. The Milligan Mesa loop overlooks lower Nutrioso where Ike Clanton (of the OK Corral Gunfight fame) had his home. Bring some cold drinks and snacks and you can be back in Round Valley for lunch. Please note: A maximum clearance of 53" is available at certain points on this trail. If you are riding a Polaris Ranger, Yamaha Rhino, or a similar rig, please choose another ride because of the clearance problem.
- 9. Clanton Clan Rendezvous:** ATVs only under 53" wide! Available Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. This is a 67-mile

ride that will leave from the rodeo grounds going up Picnic Hill down through Sipe Wildlife Area to the cool pines and aspen trees surrounding Pat Knoll. Ride by the old Clanton homestead where the Clanton family rendezvoused after their many runs into southern Arizona. Also, view portions of the Coronado Trail, a popular highway trip in Arizona. This ride also will take you through the OD Ridge area which always promises some of the best wildlife viewing on the Outlaw Trail. Bring your lunch. This ride is rated as "Intermediate". **Ride sponsored by Apache County.**

10. Wildlife Viewing At Its Best: UTVs OK! **Available Wednesday, Thursday only!** 14 mile ride. The White Mountains of Arizona is well known for its Rocky Mountain trophy elk herd. Sipe's Wildlife Area was created by the Arizona Game & Fish to allow visitors access to these incredible animals. This ride will leave from the rodeo grounds at 3:30 pm to enable participants to be at Sipe's by 4:30 pm. Bruce Sitko with the Game & Fish will be your guide and give a short presentation and then hike with you a short ways (1/2 mile) to the wildlife viewing area. This is a prime time to view the bull elk at the start of his mating season or "rut". Hearing a bull elk bugle is a thrill of a lifetime! Bring your binoculars, camera, flashlight, and make sure you have headlights on your ATV because you will be traveling back to the rodeo grounds in the dark.

11. Sipe Wildlife Area Tours: UTVs OK! Available Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. This ride starts at the rodeo grounds and travels up Picnic Hill and over to the Sipe Wildlife Area - about 18 miles roundtrip. You will be given a guided tour of this beautiful wildlife refuge by Arizona Game & Fish employee, Bruce Sitko. You will be back in time for lunch. Rated for "Beginners".

****12. Hank Sharp Ride:** ATVs only under 53" wide! Available on Wednesday, Thursday & Friday. Hank was a real local character. After leaving the Colorado area, he moved his family to a farm in Nutrioso where he raised his seven children alone after the death of his wife. It has been rumored that he was a member of the Butch Cassidy gang, but his Arizona neighbors and relatives know him only as an Apache County deputy sheriff! This fast-paced ride covers about 80 miles, taking you from the rodeo grounds up into the Nutrioso area and through Auger Canyon, our favorite spot on the Outlaw Trail. This trail is rated for the "Intermediate" rider and will be an all day ride. Bring your sack lunch. **Ride sponsored by Car Quest of Springerville.**

13. Casa Malpais Archaeological Park Tour: UTVs OK! Available Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. This ride leaves the rodeo grounds and participants will ride their ATVs to the Casa Malpais Museum located on Main Street in Springerville. From here you will follow a museum tour guide to the archaeological site. The tour lasts around 1 ½ hours and is an incredible adventure for the lover of Indian ruins. The ride is for the "Beginner" and is worth the trip. The tour fee is included in your registration fee.

14. Hannagan Meadow Loop: UTVs OK! Trailered Ride! Available Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. This ride requires trailering your ATV 30 miles to Alpine. From Alpine you will ride south through some of the most spectacular country along the Coronado Trail. From Alpine up South Mountain down into the Campbell Blue, then up Middle Mountain down into the Beaver Creek drainage, and then on to Horton Creek to Hannagan, this trail follows old logging spurs through rugged, wildlife-loaded backcountry. This country is considered by many to be some of the best trophy elk country in the world. This ride will be around 100 miles and is rated Advanced for fast-paced riders who enjoy a challenge of steep climbs. Sports quads are not recommended on this trail. Lunch can be purchased at the beautiful Hannagan Meadows Lodge or you can picnic overlooking the little valley. Extra gas is recommended,

but also is available at the Hannagan Meadow Lodge store.

- 15. Coronado Trail Marathon:** UTVs OK! Available Wednesday only! This is an overnight ride that will leave the rodeo grounds at 7 am on Wednesday morning and return Thursday evening. Riders will stop in Alpine for lunch at the Bear Wallow café and then ride on to Hannagan Meadows to spend the night. Reservations for cabins can be made by calling the Hannagan Meadow's Lodge at 928.339.4370. Riders will be responsible for their own meals and lodging. Dry camping (no showers) will also be available at Hannagan Meadow's campground. This would be an awesome "couples" ride for that adventurous team! This ride will be limited to 15 Advanced, fast-paced riders only - NO EXCEPTIONS. Sports quads are not recommended on this ride because of some steep and rocky terrain. Roundtrip ride is around 210+ miles. Elevation on this ride is over 9,000' so be sure and pack warm clothes accordingly. Please make sure that your ATVs are in peak running condition and headlights are mandatory. NOTE: Please read over the "Suggestions for Coronado Marathon Ride" located under - Outlaw Trail Info - on our website.
- 16. Ben Lilly Trail:** UTVs OK! Trailered Ride! Available Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. - This ride will require you to trailer your wheeler to the Alpine staging area. Our very own Outlaw Trail Poet, Chris Isaacs, once said that if God had a summer home, it would be on Terry Flat at the top of Escudilla Mountain. Elevations will be pushing 10,000' at the top. One of the many sites we will visit along the way is the gravesite of Jacob Hamblin in Alpine, early Arizona pioneer. See firsthand the rugged, beautiful terrain Ben Lilly hunted grizzlies in! This trail is a must for the lover of Aspen-covered gold mountainsides! This ride has some steep, rocky climbs to make your ride more interesting! The ride will be about 30 miles long and is rated Intermediate. Bring a sack lunch. **Ride sponsored by Tal Wi Wi Lodge in Alpine.**
- 17. Oscar Schultz Circle:** Sprucedale Guest Ranch Overnight Ride. Available on Wednesday, Thursday (**Both overnite, not-trailered rides**), Friday. **On Friday - this ride will be for UTVs only and will be a trailered ride.** Difficulty: Intermediate - 65-85 miles each way.
- Sprucedale Guest Ranch Overnite Ride!!!** Wednesday & Thursday Only! This year we are excited to add another overnight ride into beautiful Sprucedale. If you are looking for an escape from all your cares and worries, then this is the perfect place for you! Sprucedale is a remote rustic working cattle ranch located about 10 miles south of Big Lake. To sign up for this ride, sign up for the Oscar Schultz Circle, Ride #17, on either Wednesday or Thursday. You will leave the rodeo grounds on Wednesday or Thursday morning and ride to Sprucedale, have a homestyle dinner, sleep in one of their rustic cabins, help with the milking (!), have breakfast, pick up your sack lunch, and travel back to the Rodeo Grounds in Eagar. The ride leaving Wednesday morning will return on Thursday afternoon and the ride leaving Thursday morning will return Friday afternoon. **Riders will be responsible for their own meals and lodging. Reservations for cabins & meals can be made by calling Sprucedale Ranch at 928-333-4984.** Another highlight of this trail experience is the opportunity to take a short ride on the ranch and see the original burial spot of Oscar Schultz. Old Oscar was first buried on the private land at the ranch and then moved to his current resting place along the trail. Ellis Wiltbank with Sprucedale will be your guide at the ranch and is an expert on the local history associated with the ranch. Sprucedale has a large lodge where their meals are served with a big wood-burning stove to cozy around in the evenings. For further info on Sprucedale, visit their website at: www.sprucedaleranch.com. Bring a sack lunch and extra gas for your trip into Sprucedale.
- UTV only ride on Friday! Friday only!** This ride will require you to trailer your UTV to the Williams

Valley Staging Area. This is about a 65 mile loop that will leave Alpine by South Mountain down into the Campbell Blue. You will be able to visit the lonely grave of Oscar Schultz on Coyote Creek and then back to Alpine. Oscar Schultz was a German immigrant that got desperate to get some money to send to his sick mother back in Germany and robbed a bank in McNary and was shot and killed by the posse that pursued him! Bring a sack lunch. **If you have any questions about how to register for this ride, please contact us at our toll free number - 866-520-3569.

18. Bill Stinson Memorial Ride: UTVs OK! Trailered Ride! Available Wednesday, Thursday. This ride will require you to trailer your ATV 45 miles to the Horton Creek Staging Area. The Bill Stinson Memorial Ride will take you into some rugged bear country where Ben Lilly was known to trail Grizzlies back in the old days. Some of the sites on this trail are Horton Creek and then on to Hannagan Meadows then dropping off on the east drainage of Willow Creek. The ride will be about 36 miles and is rated Advanced due to very steep, rocky terrain. Gas and snacks will be available at the Hannagan Meadows store. Elevations will reach around 9,000’.

19. Saffel Canyon Night Ride/Poker Run: ATVs only under 53” wide! Available Wednesday & Thursday nights only. This will be a fun ride for the “kid at heart”! Follow the Saffel Canyon trail to the Point of the Mountain and back to the rodeo grounds -- adventure all along the way! Ride will leave at 8:00 pm from the rodeo grounds and will have you back by 10 p.m. Rated Intermediate - must have headlights, flashlight, and warm jacket to go!! Great prizes for the winning hands! Please note: A maximum clearance of 53” is available at certain points on this trail. If you are riding a Polaris Ranger, Yamaha Rhino, or a similar rig, please choose another ride because of the clearance problem. This is an 18 mile loop.

20. Harris Cave Hideout: UTVs OK! Trailered Ride! Available Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. *Requires trailering your ATV 18 miles. This fast-paced ride is for the Advanced rider who loves an adventure. This 40-mile ride has steep, rocky terrain, beautiful meadows, remote back country trails to Harris Cave and the top of Green’s Peak Lookout at over 10,000’ in elevation. A stop at Harris Cave will allow the spelunking adventurer the opportunity to explore this awesome cavern. Bring a change of clothes and shoes to change into if you don’t want to ride home in muddy clothes! Also bring along a sack lunch and your camera! **Ride sponsored by Walmart.**

21. Lawmen’s Memorial Ride (Shortened Version): UTVs OK! Trailered Ride! Available Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. For those of you that would like to experience the Lawmen’s Memorial Ride and not ride the whole trail, we are offering this shortened version which is about a 55 mile ride. You will be required to trailer your vehicle 12 miles to the Pat Knoll Staging Area. For further trail description, please refer to ride #5.

***This notes that this trail has geo-caches along the way. For those that don’t know –geocaching is a fun adventure game for GPS users. You will be provided with GPS coordinates along these trails as clues to find the “cache”.*

SAFETY & ETIQUETTE GUIDELINES



Please note that rides with 5 or fewer registered riders will be cancelled as of September 1, 2010. Also, any ride with 10 or fewer riders may be combined with another ride as needed.

Please pay close attention to the length of the ride you are signing up for. Each participant needs enough fuel for the total mileage of the ride plus 20% for safety. If gas is available on the trail, it will be noted.

We only have three routes out of the rodeo grounds – the Jamboree’s headquarters. Some days you might be seeing part of the same trail on your way to another trail. As we develop these trails in the coming years, we hope to have many new trails and starting points. Thanks for your patience with us! Several of the Outlaw Trail rides require that you be willing and able to transport your own ATV to designated staging areas with the group. This allows you to see more of eastern Arizona’s beautiful country and keeps our ride groups at a smaller size (about 25 or fewer). The Jamboree cannot be responsible for the transportation to these more remote areas of the Outlaw Trail. However, some local guides and other Jamboree riders will have unused trailer space and may be willing to share transportation if you ask around. Remember to “Tread Lightly” on these trails. Responsible riding, with respect for the land and the trails, will preserve your right to ride. Please don’t abuse this privilege.

Geo Caching:

1. Take something from the cache –some caches are true “Outlaw Stashes”! You will find cash prizes, ATV Raffle tickets, and other surprises.
2. Leave something in the cache (preferably not food!)
3. Write about it in the logbook. The logbook can contain much valuable, rewarding, and entertaining info. A logbook might contain info about nearby attractions, coordinates to other caches, and even jokes written by visitors. If you get some info from a logbook, you should give some back. At the very least you can leave the date and time you visited the cache. Please do not move any of the caches you find for the benefit of others.

Observe all safety precautions, laws and ordinances outlined in the “Safety” section of the registration, particularly the use of helmets, eye-protection, long-sleeved shirts, long pants, boots and gloves.

To ride in the Jamboree, you will be required to sign a waiver of liability when you pick up your participant packet. All day rides will leave from the Rodeo Grounds at 8 a.m unless otherwise announced. Please pay attention to changes made at nightly gatherings or postings. All Jamboree rides are classed as to difficulty of trail and necessary rider skill and experience. “Never-ridden”, for the person who has never ridden before & requires the very easiest of trails; “Beginner”, for riders with limited ATV experience & who requires easy trails; “Intermediate”, for the somewhat experienced, but skilled, competent rider, who requires less challenging trails; “Advanced”, for the rider who is more experienced with no limitations as to his riding ability, and who can handle the most challenging and demanding trails. We assume that each rider will accurately assess his own abilities and chose those rides which will not offer more challenges beyond his experience or ability. Beginning riders who place themselves in an advanced group become a problem to the entire group. Please choose rides accordingly. If you’re not sure which rides you would be qualified for, please call our toll-free number and ask about that particular trail.

All trails/roads used by the Jamboree are understood to be two-way. Even on narrow trails, you may find someone coming on an ATV from the opposite direction. Watch carefully for oncoming traffic on all roads and trails. Please be courteous to other riders.

On each trail ride, you will want to be prepared for possible rain, wind, or cold evening weather. Please pack snacks, food, water, extra gas, as needed on the trail. A raincoat or parka would be a good idea to have. September is the end of our summer monsoon weather and an afternoon rain shower could be a problem. You will want to pack your camera or binoculars for wildlife viewing and pictures. The mountain country is rich with wildlife.

SAFETY & ETIQUETTE GUIDELINES (Cont.)



Trail Masters will review the rules with all participants before the ride. If you have any questions regarding the rules please do ask the Trail Master.

1. Each rider is responsible for his or her own safety.
2. AZ ATV Outlaw Trail Jamboree requires wearing helmets and safety gear.
(Pants, no tank tops, goggles, boots that protect the ankles and gloves)
3. NO Alcohol or illegal drugs will be allowed while on the trail, grounds for immediate dismissal from the Jamboree.
4. Don't leave the group without informing the Trail Master.

We will not leave anybody, if you get lost from the group, we will search until you are found. In the unlikely event you do get lost, find an intersection and stay there. Searching for a moving target is very difficult; as well you could be miles from your last known location in just minutes.

5. No passing other riders while traveling the trail, Space is usually for managing dust.
6. When stopping for any reason, always keep the road open for other traffic.
Motorcycles and quads might come racing through, need to leave them some room. So don't stand in their way either, that might hurt.
7. Each rider is required to wait for the rider behind him or her at each fork or turn on the trail. As well, watch the rider behind all the time. If he/she stops for any reason, stop and wait. This will cause a chain reaction and keep the group together.

If you get to a fork and don't know which way to go.... Stop and wait for help. Even if it takes hours. If you stay on the known trail we will find you soon. If you head down a trail we did not use, it could take hours and hours to find you. As well, if you head down a trail that is not where the group went, you just became a Ride Master because everybody behind you will follow. Please realize that these trails have been designated for the jamboree only and are unmarked. The Trail Master is very acquainted and knowledgeable of the trails; for your safety, please stay with the group.

8. Turn lights on and assure plenty of spacing between riders. Lights on will help the person in front of you see you easily and quickly.
9. Ensure you have plenty of fuel and water for the length of the ride, plus some reserve of both.
10. Each participant needs to ride at his or her own pace, these guidelines provide assurance nobody will get lost or left behind. It is critical that you ride at your own pace, at your own comfort level. If you ride beyond your comfort level; (1) you are no longer having a good time, and (2) that increases the odds of an accident. Each ride has to stay on schedule to assure returning to the Rodeo Grounds on time for the next event. If the pace is too fast for a rider another Trail Master will come and get that rider and escort them back to the Rodeo Grounds. If you have this concern at all, talk with the Trail Master before leaving on the trails, or call the Jamboree office.
11. Inform the Trail Master if you are a beginner ATV Rider. The Trail Master will ask that you ride towards the front of the pack.
12. There will be restrooms available on some trails. There will be breaks and picture opportunities provided on all the trails. If you must stop while the group is moving, go ahead, but these need to be kept to a minimum. All riders will then come to a stop so the group can stay together. If you do stop, leave your ATV near the trail so those behind you will know somebody has stopped. Our tail gunner will not pass an ATV on the trail.

These rules are to ensure a safe and enjoyable trail ride for all participants. They provide you with an understanding on how the Jamboree Staff will manage leading hundreds of riders safely over hundreds of miles of trails through the beautiful White Mountains.

Relax and Enjoy the ride, the Arizona Jamboree will take care of the rest!
